LOGO OF NSS




The symbol of the National Service Scheme has been based on the **Giant Rath** Wheel of the world famous Konark Sun Temple of Orissa, India. These giant wheels of the sun temple portrays the cycles of creation, preservation and release and signify the movement in life across time and space. The design of the symbol, a simplified form of the Sun Chariot wheel primarily depicts movement. The wheel signifies the progressive cycle of life. It stands for continuity as well as change and implies the continuous striving of NSS for social transformation and enlistment.

BADGE

The NSS symbol is embossed on the NSS badge. The NSS volunteers wear it while undertaking any programme or community service. The konark wheel in the symbol has eight bars, which represent the 24 hours of the day. Hence, the badge reminds the wearer to be in readiness for the service of the nation round the clock i.e. for 24 hours. The Red Colour in

the badge indicates that the NSS volunteers are full of young blood i.e. lively, active, energetic and full of high spirit. The Navy Blue Colour indicates the cosmos of which the NSS is a tiny part, ready to contribute its share for the welfare of the mankind.



The National Service Scheme (NSS) is a great initiative that promotes community service and social development among students.


- ❖ NSS is really needed because it helps us develop a sense of social responsibility and empathy.


Financial Literacy Awareness Program by SEBI, MSME



To encourage environmental conservation and afforestation.


To sensitize students towards the importance of a clean and green environment.



Through these performances, students expressed gratitude towards the freedom fighters and conveyed messages of unity, integrity, and social harmony.



Conduction of Programme on Dog Bite Prevention and Sensitization in GRDCE Campus on World Rabies Day 2025

Description A special morning assembly session was conducted by the B.Ed trainees to create awareness among students and staff about dog bite prevention and sensitisation towards stray dogs on the campus on the eve of World Rabies Day 2025. The session aimed to promote safety, responsible behaviour, and compassionate attitudes while ensuring a secure environment for all.


The assembly began with a brief talk by the B.Ed trainees highlighting the increase in stray dog interactions in campus areas and the importance of precautionary actions.

Power Point and Video Presentation:

Trainees shared key information on Why dogs may bite (fear, provocation, territorial behaviour), how to behave around unfamiliar dogs (avoid eye contact, do not run, stay calm) and Do's and Don'ts for students when moving around campus. Video on demonstration of Safe Practices, correct ways to react when a dog approaches were also screened.

Sensitisation Message and information on First Aid by Teacher Educators”

Students were encouraged to treat animals kindly and understand that stray dogs often react due to fear or hunger. The trainees emphasised the importance of informing authorities if an aggressive dog is noticed instead of taking action on



their own. Basic steps of first aid in case of a dog bite were shared, including immediate washing of the wound, reporting to teachers, and seeking medical attention. ***Outcomes of the Session***

Increased awareness among students about dog behaviour and safety measures.

Reduction in fear and misconceptions regarding stray dogs.

Promotion of a safer and more responsible campus atmosphere.

Encouragement of humane and sensitive treatment towards animals.

Conclusion

The morning assembly session proved to be an impactful initiative by the B.Ed trainees, effectively spreading awareness about dog bite prevention and sensitisation. Such sessions play a crucial role in ensuring student safety while fostering a culture of empathy and responsibility within the campus.

The celebration successfully reinforced Gandhian values and encouraged students to imbibe them in their personal and social lives.


